- P.Bhanuprakash, NSS Program Officer, SVCR Govt. Degree College, Palamaner interacted with people of P. Kothur Village, Chittoor Mandal, Chittoor Dist. and created awareness on COVID-19.
- Conducted online Quiz on COVID-19 and created awareness on the origin, spread and preventive measures to the villagers.
- Eexplained about the symptoms, and transmission method of Novel Corona Virus, The prevention and precaution measures like Hand washing with soap, maintaining social distance, usage of masks were explained to the individuals in the village.
- With the help of village volunteer, we have identified the individuals who reached the village from the other states and counseled them to stay home for 14 days.
- Vegetables and eggs were distributed in the village with the help of the local leaders and youth of the village.
- The youth of the village were counseled about the importance "Arogya Setu App" and made them to install it.
- Sodium hypochlorite solution was sprayed on the roads and fogging was done by the village secretariat. We helped in this activity.
- The Government has supplied **free ration** for four times and **Masks** for each individual. We helped in the smooth distribution.

- As per the instructions given by HRM, SVCR Govt. Degree College, Palamaner selected Gowthemmepalli village, Baireddipalli Mandal, Chittoor District in order to study the best work done in the village, regarding response to Covid-19.
- The population of Gowthemmepalli village is 1686.
- There are 360 ration card holders. It is a small and pollution free village. Though, most of the people are semi and uneducated, they got awareness on Covid-19 through television. They strictly maintained Janatha curfew on 22nd March-2020.
- No one came out during the whole day. They strictly followed the lockdown rules.
 Everybody started using masks.
- No Covid Case is registered in the village. Most of the people in the village depend o agriculture. They continued their agricultural activities by maintain physical distance.
- The local gram Panchyath officers and the donors sprayed the bleaching powder and disinfecting chemicals all over the village.
- Each person was given three masks by the Government of Andhra Pradesh.
- A.P Grama Sachivalayam staff conducted the fever survey for four times. Grama Volunteers played a key role in identifying the people who came from other states and countries.
- The Govt. of A.P distributed free ration thrice during the lockdown period. It also gave Rs. 1000 to all the white ration card holders. It is a big relief to the poor people.
- As there was no other work, most of the labours engaged in MGNREGS works.
- In total, Covid-19 taught the people a great lesson. It made the people lead a disciplined life. It made the people to be economical.

 - To wash things after buying.
 - To stop doing journeys and not to meet new persons.
 - To make home to home survey.
 - To bring awareness through government vehicles.
